What question should I ask before I do that?



You must always ask permission to take a photo, and to ask if you can share it. It's important to respect the wishes of our friends and not to do anything that would make them uncomfortable or upset.

Who gets to see ...?

1. If I show the Head Teacher the photo on this phone/tablet who gets to see it?
2. If I send this photo to the Head Teacher in a message, who gets to see it?
3. If I share this photo online, who gets to see it?

Personal information

Some photos you take might hold clues to your personal information.

Is it okay for everyone on the internet to see those clues?

This depends on who you share it with. It would be risky to share it with everyone on the internet, but you might feel happy to share it only with your family.

A sunset

That's fine to share online. It doesn't have any clues about your personal information.

This is okay to share. It doesn't have clues about your personal information.

Where
you live

Keep this safe and don't share it online. Strangers do not need to know where you live.



Your group
of friends

Only share photos including other people if you have their permission first. This photo also shows them in their school uniform, so it's best not to share this publicly.

How can we make sure we are sharing photos safely?

Before you take and share a photo, stop, think and ask yourself ...

1. Who am I sharing this photo with?
2. Who else might get to see it?
3. What will people be able to find out about me?
4. What will people be able to find out about the other people in the photo?

The key thing to remember is to take a moment to think before you post. That applies to comments and messages too!! If anything or anyone ever upsets you online, always tell a trusted adult. They can help you feel better and help find a positive solution to your problem.
